A coordinator's guide to collect diaper essentials that support families served by The Villages.



1 When

Host your diaper drive for at least a week or longer, so people have time to purchase diapers and drop-off. Make sure the start and end date are clearly communicated.

2 Where

Choose a centrally located, high traffic spot or multiple spots for diaper drop-off. Post the "Diaper Drop-off Here" signs included in this kit.



3 Goal

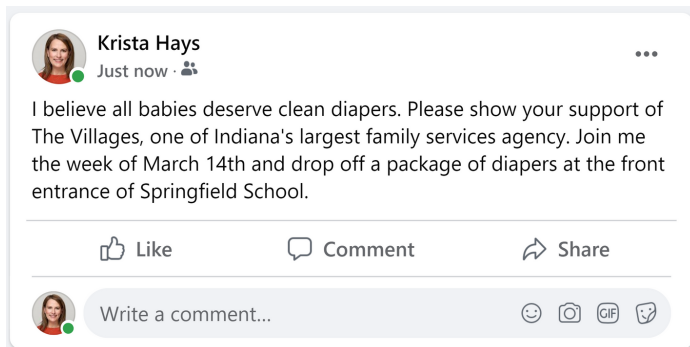
Set a predetermined, obtainable goal. This is an excellent way to spark participation. Use a goal chart. Create incentives. Make it a competition.

4 Promote

Diaper Drive Coordinator Checklist

Follow these 10 simple steps to ensure a successful diaper drive.



1. **Choose** your Diaper Drive location.
2. **Recruit** volunteers to help promote, count, collect, and deliver diapers.
3. **Select** a start and end date.
4. **Set** your diaper collection goal, theme, and/or incentives.
5. **Prep** your drop off location with visible signs.
6. **Promote** the diaper drive!
7. **Confirm** transportation for diaper delivery and Villages' office availability to accept diapers.

9. **Collect** and deliver diapers to the nearest Villages office.
10. **Share** your results on social media.
